This site for our building is in a beautiful wooded area and was chosen by Commissioner Medlen himself. It is on the east side of South 31st midway between East Dodson and Pelley Avenues.

Thus another mystery as to where the future building would be is solved by a very fine benefactor, the City of Fort Smith.

The next unsolved problem is the erection of a building. With finances in the strained condition that they are (of course, we do have a small cash reserve), it is a mystery as to how we can get our own. theatre. As in plots of all plays, the mystery clears up and the outcome is explained in time. But this is not the last act, the curtain is rising on the next scene—that of solving the mystery of a building.
