From the moment I learned that $\underbrace{\text{One Flew Over}}_{\text{Of the FSLT's 1983 Season}}$, $\underbrace{\text{Nest}}_{\text{I knew}}$ had been accepted as part $\underbrace{\text{of the FSLT's 1983 Season}}_{\text{I knew}}$ that staging it would produce some inevitable comparisons between this, the stage play, and the highly popular 1975 motion picture of the same title.

Consequently, I feel it is important to stress that the story you are about to see is not the same story that was told in that film. Although the plot lines are essentially the same; the characters, their dialogue, and their behavior often is not.

As a new and nervous director, I hope that you, our audience, will try to avoid such comparisons and judge our performance solely on the basis of its own values.

I also feel it important to point out that this is a powerful, frank, sometimes even <u>brutal</u> story. It could not be portrayed otherwise and still remain faithful to the essence, the spirit and the message of Ken Kesey's wonderful novel. Our intention is to entertain, intrigue and stimulate you while at the same time doing justice to this story as it <u>must</u> be told (if it is to be told at all).

That aside, I speak for the entire company in expressing our hope and trust that you will enjoy this rather ambitious undertaking of the Fort Smith Little Theatre. A lot of very fine people have worked very hard to bring it to you.
