WHO'S WHO IN THE CAST

JANE ANN SHORT (Kaye) began her affair with the Fort Smith Little Theatre in 1984's "An Evening with Cole Porter." Since that time, she has appeared in "Best Little Whorehouse in Texas", "Pajama Game', and "Noises Off" (in which she shed articles of clothing in each production), and "Nunsense", (in which she shed her brain as sister Mary Amnesia). In her day job, she works as a legal assistant at Warner and Smith Law Firm. The rest of her life is spent trying to aggravate everyone. It's dirty job, but someone's got to do it.

TRACY RISLEY (Donna) is a Resource Teacher at Ballman Elementary School. She graduated from Southside where she participated in the Madrigal dinner for 3 years. Tracy attended Oklahoma Christian in OKC and appeared in "A Marriage Has Been Arranged". Since returning to Ft. Smith, she has performed with *One Accord*, an accapella women's group from West-Ark Church of Christ. This is Tracy's first show with Ft. Smith Little Theatre.

LYNDA TAYLOR (Peggy) is making her debut on the stage of the Fort Smith Little Theatre. However, she is no stranger to those of us backstage. She served as a prompter for "Miss Firecracker Contest" and "Rumors". Lynda also wants everyone to know that she is not really like the character she plays in "Taffetas" - just wait till you see her. BEV ROGERS (Cheryl) moved to Vian, OK from Wichita, KS three years ago to be closer to her retired parents. She brought with her four teenage offspring-Jennifer (19), responsible for her mother's re-entry into the world of theatre, Jeremy and Jessica (17), responsible for their mother's crazed outlook on life, and Joseph (15) responsible for his mother's humility. Since then she has modeled for the infamous Mary Kay Cosmetic Co. She is pursuing a modeling career, but she has not yet quit her day job at ABF Freight Systems.

RONALD JOHNSON (Cameraman) has just finished a successful run in the FSLT production of "A Few Good Men". He again appeared for tryouts of "The Taffetas" not to be on stage but to work as crew on props. Well, Soni thought he would be good in the part of the cameraman and the rest is history. Here he is again!

CLARK RISLEY (Stagehand) holds a BSE in speech from Oklahoma Christian. He was involved in all areas of theatrical productions while there. This is his first appearance on the FSLT stage.

RILEY BLACK (Doggie in the Window), at only 5 months is a newcomer to the Little Theatre and the world in general. His past performances include looking pitiful when left alone, and acting innocent after piddling on the floor. His hobbies include sleeping, chewing up ink pens, and barking throughout the wee hours of the morning.
