DIRECTOR'S NOTES...

Here we go again! For the third time in four years I find myself charged with bringing a Neil Simon show to life for FortSmith Little Theatre patrons. After directing **Broadway Bound** and **Fools**, it seems appropriate to offer Simon's **Lost In Yonkers** to our audience.

Many critics believe this script is Simon's crowning achievement as a playwright. The people presenting the Best Play Tony Award and the Pulitzer prize for Drama apparently agreed with both honors.

Yonkers is a superb vehicle for actors. Because of its depth of characterization, Simon's work offers significant challenges to the accomplished actor. At the same time, the playwright gives the novice actor such well written lines and logical motivation that a certain measure of success is assured due to the quality of the script. Our cast has proven itself more than capable of ferreting out the script's nuances and creating a believability that is mandatory if the play is to deliver its full emotional wallop.

Working with FSLT veterans Katy Boulden, Wendy Quick, Debbie Carney, and Greg Davis has been an altogether expected pleasure. Their professionalism and dedication are much appreciated. Bill Woodell is a first timer on our stage. As always, new talent brings a dynamic freshness to a production and a pleasure to work with both these young men.

So, here we go again! Three Simon scripts, done; 34 or so to go!
