Nancy Blochberger (Ethel Banks)... "I think Ethel could be a role model for us all. Beneath her sarcastic humor and periodic bouts of hysteria, lies a caring, concerned individual. I've enjoyed making new friends and the chance to be on stage with some old ones (no pun intended, Jim)."

Jim Moody (Victor Velasco). . . "I always wanted to be in this play. I thought I would get to play Robert Redford in his wonder years, instead I'm playing Charles Boyer in his golden years — ah, as time goes by!"

Neil Simon's *Barefoot in the Park* was first presented in New York's Biltmore Theater on October 23, 1963. It featured Elizabeth Ashley, Robert Redford, Mildred Natwick, and Kurt Kasner. In 1964, Mike Nichols received a Tony Award for his direction of the play. One of Simon's most recognized and beloved works, the show enjoyed a long Broadway run, and is a classic American movie.
