Brooke learns at the last moment that her caterer Caren is her boss's much disliked ex-daughter-in-law. Disasters keep coming as Brooke and her friends try to serve dinner and keep the boss and caterer separated.

Director Tina Dale has an experienced stage crew supporting her including Grace Andrews, assistant director; Joe Graham, producer; Audra Sargent, stage manager; and Gary Cameron, set design. The set construction crew includes Gary Cameron, Scott Black, Brett Short and Coleman Smith. Sharla Cameron is in charge of props and Sandra McPherson serves as costumer. Show running crew includes Nicole Bostick and Lexi Housley. Show art is designed by Scott Black. Logan Davis serves as light designer. Tina Dale and Gary Cameron are in charge of sound design and sound booth respectively.

Dale is excited to bring this comedy to FSLT: "This play spoke to me the minute I read it. It's the fast-paced incredibly funny farce I enjoy, but it also honors women fighting to break the glass ceiling. It's a very comical homage to our grandmothers, aunts and mothers who took up the fight before us. It's also a way to show our daughters, nieces and granddaughters that reaching for the stars can get a little painful and crazy sometimes, but it's always worth it."

Performer Ian Miller enjoys playing physical comedy as bookstore owner Donny. "I just love comedies and discovering comic characters," he said. "The physicality of my character is the biggest challenge for me in this show."

Cast member Ashleigh Mathews is also enjoying the physical challenges of her role. "Caren does a lot of physical comedy. Juggling dishes, trays full of appetizers, running back and forth from the kitchen to

the dining area! That's really what got me interested in playing her."

Monica Longoria is enjoying the challenge of playing Brooke: "Brooke is careeroriented and wants to be seen in her company. This character is very relatable and fun."

Lora Rice (Louise) explains that she doesn't have to stop for dinner before rehearsal: ""Louise takes an appetizer' is in the script instructions 12 times!"

Dilemmas with Dinner opens at 7:30 p.m. Thursday, April 13 followed by evening performances April 14-15 and 19-22. A matinee is scheduled for 2 p.m. Sunday, April 16. Opening Night tickets (including a champagne reception preshow and dessert at intermission) are \$20; all others performances are \$12. Season Flex Pass patrons can begin selecting seats at 7 am Saturday April 1. Tickets go on sale to the general public at 7 am Thursday April 6. Purchase tickets/select seats online at fslt.org or call 479-783-2966 (extn. 2) to purchase through a box office volunteer.

Director Dale concludes, "In a farce, timing is everything – entrances, exits, line delivery, even facial reactions must be timed. In this show, we also have to time the use of props and eating on stage. After all, you can't say your line with a crab puff in your mouth. Speaking of time – we hope you'll select a time to attend *Dilemmas with Dinner*. It's one dinner party you won't want to miss."
