June brings to the Fort Smith Little Theatre, the reprise of a modern comedy classic *Moon Over Buffalo*. The Ken Ludwig favorite is directed by Duff Taylor who has an affinity for Ludwig's work; Taylor has directed several Ludwig shows including *Leading Ladies, The Game's Afoot*, and *Fox on the Fairway*. Previously performed at FSLT in 1999, the show was first produced on Broadway in 1995 starring Carol Burnett and Phillip Bosco in Tony-award-nominated performances. The script is popular with audiences and actors alike, for it offers loads of laughs, fast paced physical humor, and razor sharp dialogue – plus a happy ending!

The story revolves around traveling stage actors Charlotte and George Hay (Sally Story and Brett Short) who are playing *Cyrano de Bergerac* and *Private Lives* in repertory in 1953 Buffalo, New York. While George is satisfied with his stage career, Charlotte dreams of Hollywood stardom. When famed film director Frank Capra agrees to watch their performance to consider the duo for parts in a film, mishaps and misunderstandings ensue. At one point, the actors are even confused about which play they are performing!

Adding to the hijinks is George's affair with ingenue Eileen (Meghan Partain) which has driven Charlotte into the arms of successful lawyer Richard (John Hall). Daughter

#### Moon Over Buffalo opens June 9

Rosalind (Carole Sikes Cannedy) is visiting with new fiancé Howard (Hunter Seegers), Charlotte's hard of hearing mother Ethel (Kiane Anderson) creates complications, and Rosalind's old flame Paul (Ian Miller) still holds a torch. All this is played out on a stage with five doors requiring well-timed entrances and exits.

Director Duff Taylor is supported by an experienced crew. Jamie Lambdin-Bolin serves as producer while Cliff Scott serves as both assistant director and stage manager. Janet Renwick is the costume designer. Properties are handled by Sharla Cameron, Carol Smith, and Tiffany Parker. T.J. Dudley is the lighting designer, Ashleigh Mathews is handling sound design, and Mike Tickler will serve as the light/sound technician. Duff Taylor and Gary Cameron are in charge of set design and construction.

Leads Brett Short and Sally Story are welcome new faces at FSLT. Short made his FSLT debut last fall as Colonel Mustard in Clue. Short praises "the classic and nostalgic feel of the story. The quick pace and humor remind me of comedies from 1950s television." Story is making her acting debut at FSLT as Charlotte, bringing years of experience acting and directing. She appreciates the atmosphere inside FSLT: "There isn't a bad seat in the house. Plus the intimacy of the space gives the audience a chance to connect with the actors (and vice versa), feeding off each other's energy." Story has focused on directing more in recent years, so she is excited to get back to the stage. "The physical demands are pretty challenging because the pacing for Moon Over Buffalo is super fast."

FSLT veteran Kiane Anderson admires the script, "I saw it years ago starring Carol Burnett and I loved it!" She also has affection for her character: "Ethel is self-confident, sure of who she is, and who she loves and doesn't love." Carol Sikes Cannady is happy to return to FSLT post pandemic. "After a long and tumultuous two years, we all need a reminder that what united us in laughter before all of this discord still makes us laugh today."

FSLT veteran Meghan Partain agrees, "I would love our audiences to laugh until their bellies hurt at this show. So many things distract us, and it can be easy to focus on the things that are bringing us down. Coming to the theatre and working on this hilarious show with an incredible cast and crew has been a more than welcome distraction for me. I love getting to laugh with my friends every night, and I hope we can give our audience the same experience."

Moon Over Buffalo opens June 9 with additional 7:30 pm performances scheduled for June 10-11 and 15-18. A matinee will be performed at 2 p.m. Sunday June 12. Tickets for the opening night performance are \$20; all other performances are \$12. For Season Flex Pass patrons, seat selection will begin at 7:00 a.m. Saturday, May 28. Tickets will go on sale to the general public beginning 7:00 a.m. Thursday, June 2. You can buy tickets and select your seats online at fslt. org or by calling 479-783-2966 (extn. 2).

#### From the Top...

#### Honoring Descendants of FSLT's "Founding Mother" June 9



In the mid-1940s, Florabel Kennebrew, a theatre graduate of Northwestern University, came to Fort Smith to visit her sister whose husband was stationed at Fort Chaffee. During that visit, Flo was set up on a date with another Chaffee soldier, James Pattee, Jr. If Flo and James had not hit it off, wed, and started their married life in Fort Smith, it's unlikely our community theatre would have been started, and you would not be reading this today.

In 1947, Flo (shown above) persuaded the Young Ladies Guild of Sparks Hospital to produce a theatrical production as a fundraiser. Following that proposal, a community theatre - the first in Arkansas - was organized. It would be sponsored by the Guild with Flo in the driver's seat. The group of amateur thespians flourished under Flo's tutelage and by 1952, when the Pattees moved to Louisville, FSLT was strong enough to buy their first "home" on North O Street and operate independently without a sponsor. Flo did more than make a proposal; she provided a firm foundation for the organization that still thrives today.

On June 9, we will have the opportunity to recognize the descendants of FSLT's "founding mother" who are traveling from Louisville to attend the opening night of Moon Over Buffalo. Obviously all of our patrons and volunteers won't be able to attend that one performance, so here's an idea. Stop what you're doing, put your hands together, and applaud Flo Pattee for using her energy, training, and leadership to make a lasting legacy in our community. Thank you, Florabel!
