- David Steadham: This is David's third on-stage appearance at FSLT. He was in the reading of Waiting For Lefty and played the role of Tony in last year's You Can't Take It With You. As Tony, David had to do his first stage kiss ever, and now he has to suffer through his wife, Heather's first stage kiss.
