Offerings in the Fort Smith Little Theatre's 75th season have run the gamut. There have been encore productions from our past; shows that were well established but new to our stage; and now *Coffee Shop* making it's on-stage debut when it opens on November 10.

Written and directed by FSLT volunteer Jamie Lambdin-Bolin, the script was inspired by her own experiences working at local coffee shops. When she took a new job to explore her career opportunities, Lambdin-Bolin realized she missed the flavor (excuse the pun) and the family-feel of the coffee shop. Thus, her barista experiences became the subject of her script.

The story revolves around a coffee shop staff that gets along well. They work as a team when it's busy, and they share a lot with each other when it's not. Unfortunately, the business is not doing well, so the owner Gale (Joanne Peterson) asks her business-savvy sister Margot (Tina Dale) for help. While this leads to improvements, it also creates friction, especially between Margot and employee Irene (Audra Sargent).

Among the coffee shop clientele are two brothers, Gordon (Ian Miller) and Nicholas (Eric Wells). Drama swirls around ditzy Luanne (Megan Bagley) and her fiancé Marty (Christian Meurer), for Luanne enjoys men as much as she does her arts and crafts. There's also a frequent customer (Charles Belt) who is so annoying that no one on the staff wants to wait on him. Behind the scenes is a capable crew. Scott Black, set designer, is assisted in construction by Gary Cameron, Rusty Peoples, and Kim Peoples. Logan Davis and Jorgi Anderson comprise the technical crew, and properties are handled by Sharla Cameron. Logan Davis is stage manager, Brandon Bolin is producer, and Emilee Dale and Shannon Stoddard are production consultants.

While the storyline is not based on real events, the characters are a loose composite of people well known to Lambdin-Bolin including some very strong Southern women. Lambdin-Bolin was raised in Alma, Arkansas surrounded by many of those. She confides, "They often drive us crazy but we love them just the same."

Autumn Howard who plays employee Sam commented, "It's exciting to be part of a show at FSLT after seeing so many on this stage as part of the audience." This will be her first time under the lights since high school.

Audra Sargent is also marking a first by taking the role of Irene. Sargent has assisted backstage in numerous productions over the years. She even met and married her husband, Charles Belt, while volunteering at FSLT. But *Coffee Shop* will mark her performance debut. "I'm honored to have the chance to bring Irene and her vulnerability to life – and I've developed a new appreciation for learning lines!"

According to active FSLT volunteer, Joanne Peterson, "I wanted to say 'I was in the premiere cast of *Coffee Shop*" – plus I wanted a new challenge. I've worked in numerous crew capacities and had small parts in two productions, but this is my first prominent on-stage role. It's ironic, though, that my character, Gale, owns the coffee shop, when in reality, I don't even like coffee!"

"Delivering Luanne's lines with as much Southern twang and sass as I can muster" is a key goal for Megan Bagley. She also wants the audience to feel the full range of emotion. Ian Miller who plays Gordon agrees. "This script plays well on all levels. Audiences will have the chance to shed a tear and laugh out loud."

Director/Author Lambdin-Bolin describes *Coffee Shop* as a slice of life. "It's about relationships that give us a safe place and shelter when life doesn't go our way. The story also reminds us that we don't have to love everything about the people we love. After all, they probably don't love everything about us. And we might draw strength in life from where we least expect it."

Evening performances November 10-19 begin at 7:30 p.m. There will be a 2 p.m. matinee Sunday November 13. Seat selection for Season Flex Pass patrons begins at 7 am **Saturday, October 29**. Tickets will go on sale to the general public at 7 a.m. **Thursday, November 3**. Tickets are \$20 for opening night and \$12 for all other performances.
