

# A CHRISTMAS CAROL HOLIDAY CLASSIC OPENS AT FSLT

"GOD BLESS US, EVERY ONE!" —TINY TIM

Usher in the holidays with the Charles Dickens classic *A Christmas Carol* November 8 through 18 at FSLT. Co-directed by Rikkee Black and Tina Dale, the show was adapted by Mike Ferrians and Brenda Chapman. The 1843 novella has been adapted into countless theatre, television and film adaptations. Among the best known are the 1951 British adaptation starring Alistair Sim as Scrooge and *The Muppet Christmas Carol* from 1992 starring Michael Caine.

On Christmas Eve miserly Ebenezer Scrooge (Jon Gustafson) spurns the holiday cheer of his poor clerk Bob Cratchit (Ian Miller) and dismisses the dinner invitation of his nephew Fred Hollowell (Eric Wells). Later Scrooge is visited by the ghost of his former partner Jacob Marley (Duff Taylor) who warns him that three spirits will visit him this night to show him Christmas Past (Isabella Ree), Christmas Present (Megan Henley) and Christmas Yet to Come (Joanne Peterson). Will Scrooge learn the error of his ways and find the spirit of Christmas?

Directors Rikkee Black and Tina Dale are excited to bring the show to FSLT. Black says "I love working with Tina as a codirector. I find her ideas and vision inspiring. We have different strengths and directing styles, but rather than fighting against each other, they complement and work together well." Megan Henley is thrilled to be playing the Spirit of Christmas Present. "Coming back to the FSLT stage after a hiatus of seven years has been a wonderful experience; one that truly feels like coming home. It fills my heart with joy to make magic with friends both old and new."

# From the Top...


